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## Population Profile

The 2018 population estimate for St.Charles is 621 . Between 2010 and 2018 the population decreased by $-4.9 \%$. The City of St.Charles is in Madison County. Madison County saw a $3.4 \%$ population increase between 2010 and 2018. St.Charles's population is predominantly White. Between 2000 and 2010 there was a decrease in the percent of White population.

The median value of owner-occupied housing units is lower in St.Charles than for Madison County. There's a lower percentage of vacant housing units in St.Charles than there is for Madison County. Many housing units in St.Charles were built between 1960 to 1979. There is a lower percentage of individuals 25 and older with a Bachelor's degree or higher in St.Charles compared to Madison County.

Earnings data are provided for the population 16 and over who have earnings. Median ${ }^{4}$ earnings in St.Charles tend to be higher than the median earnings for Madison County. Families with children tend to have a higher rate of poverty than families without children.
